	The 10 human rights	Ensure that	
1.	Right to life	you fulfil your duty to give life-saving or emergency care whenever necessary.	
2.	Right to the highest attainable level of health	the level of care received by your patient is the highest available and feasible in your setting.	
3.	Right to receive the benefits of scientific progress	the patient benefits from the latest available scientific knowledge and innovations, whenever possible.	
4.	Right to privacy	the patient is provided with adequate privacy during examinations/procedures and is exposed only to the extent that is required.	
		there will be no unnecessary questions as to personal matters and/or issues not concerning the clinical situation.	
5.	Right to confidentiality	information regarding the patient obtained in the course of providing care is protected from being divulged to others without a clinical or legal justification/ the patient's permission.	
6.	Right to information	the patient is given adequate information on the clinical situation and all necessary treatment, in simple terms.	
7.	Right to autonomy in decision making	the patient is involved in the planning of the care, based on a shared decision-making model. the patient's views are taken into account.	
8.	Right to choose the number and spacing of children	 the patient is fully informed on the family planning methods available and that they are fully understood. the patient's right to decide on the number and spacing of pregnancies is respected, bearing in mind scientific recommendations for mother and foetus. 	
9.	Right to non-discrimination	care is not denied to the patient on the basis of religion, race, political views or profession.	
10.	Right to be free from torture and inhuman, cruel and degrading treatment	the right to be treated with dignity at all times is respected, especially in times of vulnerability, such as after sexual violence and during labor.
