## Introduction

This document is designed to provide FIGO member societies with a clear, concise understanding of the nominations process that will be followed by FIGO in selecting its Trustees and Council members for the 2021-2023 "term".

It contains information on how to submit nominations to FIGO, the relevant deadlines and the criteria to be followed.

Society officials should please read this document carefully before making any nominations on behalf of your society.

Nomination Forms may be found on in Appendix 1. Please note that Nomination Forms that do not comply with the stipulated criteria and/or do not provide the necessary supporting information will not be considered.

Further information on the proposed voting process to be adopted during the FIGO General Assembly that is scheduled to take place in October at the time of the XXIII FIGO World Congress of Gynecology & Obstetrics will be circulated in early July along with the formal notice of the General Assembly.

## FIGO Elections and the FIGO Articles and Bye Laws

The election process followed by FIGO is governed primarily by the FIGO Articles of Association and Bye Laws (copies of which may be found on the FIGO Website at <a href="https://www.figo.org/structure-and-governance">https://www.figo.org/structure-and-governance</a>). A summary of the clauses relevant to the nomination process can also be found in Appendix 2. The guidance and criteria set out in this document are designed to fulfil these requirements.

The sections of the Articles and Bye Laws relating to the nominations process are provided in Appendix 1 for ease of reference.

## **Election Timetable**

In accordance with the requirements set out in our Articles of Association, the following schedule will be adopted for the elections taking place in 2021.

Nomination information provided to member societies	At least six months before a General Assembly (Included in this document)
Deadline for nominations to be submitted to FIGO	7 June 2021 i.e. to allow time for the Secretariat to collate information and seek the required supporting documentation from trustee and member society candidates.
Formal notice of General Assembly sent to all member societies	9 July
Candidates advised to member societies within General Assembly Briefing Pack Part 1	No later than 21 July 2021 (At least three months before the date fixed for the General Assembly)
Presentation on voting made to General Assembly	First session of General Assembly
Electronic voting to select FIGO Officer Trustees and Regional Trustees	First and/or second session of General Assembly
Electronic voting to select FIGO Council members	Second session of General Assembly

## **Nominations Process**

All FIGO member societies are now invited to send their nominations for the following posts:

- a) Trustees of FIGO
  - Officer Trustees (x 4)
  - Regional Trustees (x 5)
- b) Member societies to be represented on the FIGO Council (x 12)

In making your society's nominations, please use the Nomination Forms provided in Appendix 1 ensuring that they are completed in full. Please remember to attach the written consent of each of your nominees for FIGO Trustee roles.

All nominations supported by adequate data will, in accordance with the FIGO Articles of Association and Bye Laws, be submitted to the General Assembly for vote. The list of nominations will be included in the General Assembly Briefing Pack (Part 1) circulated to FIGO member societies at least three months before the General Assembly.

To allow time for the processing of applications and obtaining supporting documentation form nominees, it will be necessary to ensure that your society completes and returns the Nomination Forms to the FIGO Secretariat Office by 14.00 hrs (GMT) on Monday 7 June.

Nominations received by the FIGO Office after Monday 7 June will not be considered.

# Nominations for FIGO Trustees (Officer Trustees and Regional Trustees)

Please read the notes carefully before making any nominations.

Forms that do not comply with the stipulated criteria and/or do not provide the necessary supporting information will not be considered.

## **General nomination guidance**

- 1. **Member Societies must be up to date with all fees.** Those Societies who are not up to date with their fees are classed as 'non-voting members'.
- 2. N.B. Non-voting members are:
  - not eligible for election to FIGO Council
  - not entitled to nominate candidates for Trustee positions
  - not entitled to vote at any FIGO General Meeting or General Assembly
- 3. You must ensure your societies fees are completely up to date prior to the nominations' deadline (Monday 7 June 14.00 hrs UTC).
- 4. Nomination forms may be found in Appendix 1.
- 5. FIGO member societies are encouraged to make only 1 nomination for each Trustee position and up to 12 nominations for positions on the Council.

## Trustee nomination guidance

- 1. For the 2021 2023 term, the President-Elect will be elected from candidates who are citizens of countries in the Africa and Eastern Mediterranean region.
- 2. Each candidate for election as a Trustee must be nominated by an officer of a Voting Member.
- 3. Please note that, for each of the Regional Trustee positions, nominations can only be made for each Regional Trustee position by an officer of a member society <u>from that region.</u>
- 4. A person cannot be nominated for more than one Trustee post.
- 5. A person cannot be nominated as a candidate for election as both an Officer Trustee and a Regional Trustee.
- 6. Upon retirement an Officer shall not be eligible for re-election to the office previously held except that each of the Honorary Treasurer and Honorary Secretary shall be eligible for re-election to the same office for one further term of two years.
- 7. Upon retirement each of the Vice-President, Honorary Treasurer and Honorary Secretary shall be eligible for election to another Officer post but not as a Regional Trustee.

- 8. A candidate for Regional Trustee cannot be nominated in respect of more than one region.
- 9. Due consideration should be given to the need for geographic balance among the Officer Trustees.
- Societies might wish to consider nominating female colleagues in order to achieve gender balance.
- 11. It is not necessary to make a nomination for each and every post although member societies are encouraged to participate fully in the nominations process.
- 12. Nominees must agree in writing to become a candidate for any Trustee post. Failure to attach a candidate's 'Trustee Declaration & Consent Form' to the nomination form will invalidate the nomination.
- 13. Please complete all sections of the appropriate Trustee nomination form. Ensure that the information you provide supports the suitability of the candidate for the post.
- 14. For all Trustee nominations, please include the following;
  - a) Completed nomination form (see Appendix 1)
  - b) Trustee declaration and consent form (See Appendix 1)
- 15. Upon receipt of nominations, all nominated candidates will subsequently be asked to provide the following which will be made available online and included in information circulated to voting delegates at the General Assembly:
  - 2-page CV or biographical data.
  - A 'headshot' photo
  - A brief video to support their candidacy that must be 2 minutes or less in length.

## **General responsibilities of Trustee roles**

The following excerpts from the FIGO Bye Laws sets out the general responsibilities of the different Trustee roles.

## **The President**

Bye Law 3.5 sets out the role of the President as follows.

'The President has the important task of being the figurehead and providing leadership to FIGO.

The President shall be responsible for:

- chairing the Board of Trustees and presiding over other FIGO meetings including those of Members;
- b) chairing each session of the General Assembly
- c) recommending to the Board of Trustees persons for appointment to any Committee;
- d) providing support and advice to the CEO; and
- e) ensuring that FIGO is managed effectively and in line with strategy and long-term goals approved by the Board of Trustees'.

The current President is Dr Carlos Fuchtner (Bolivia). The current President-Elect is Dr Jeanne Conry (USA).

#### The President-Elect

## Bye Law 3.7 sets out the role of the President Elect as follows.

The President Elect shall be elected from each Region on a rotational basis as determined by the Board of Trustees. The President Elect shall be responsible for:

- a) supporting the President and preparing to assume his or her role at the end of their term;
- b) learning about the projects, management and structure of FIGO; and
- c) appointing for, when he or she becomes President, the new chair and members of the Congress Organizing Committee and Congress Scientific Program Committee

N.B. For the 2021 – 2023 term, the President-Elect will be elected from candidates who are citizens of countries within the Africa and Eastern Mediterranean region.

## The Vice-President

Bye Law 3.6 sets out the role of the Vice President as follows.

The Vice President shall be responsible for:

- a) Acting as the President's nominee, should the need arise, in respect of the chairing of the General Assembly
- b) Deputising for the President.
- c) In the event of the demise, resignation or other vacation of office of the President the Vice-President will assume presidential office until the next General Assembly.
- d) Undertaking responsibility for one or more of FIGO's major programmes
- e) Acting as Chair of the Education, Communication and Advocacy Consortium (ECAC)

The current Vice-President is Dr Faysal El Kak (Lebanon) and, having served one term of office, is not eligible for re-election to this position but is eligible for election to another Officer Trustee position under the terms of Article 24.4 of the FIGO Articles.

## The Honorary Treasurer

## Bye Law 3.9 sets out the role of the Honorary Treasurer as follows.

The Honorary Treasurer, whilst working closely with the CEO and Director of Finance, shall be ultimately responsible for ensuring that the following activities are undertaken:

- a) making sure that FIGO keeps proper accounts;
- b) reviewing FIGO's financial performance;
- c) drawing up or reviewing policies for finance and investment;
- d) ensuring that FIGO has robust and effective financial controls in place;
- e) liaising with finance staff and FIGO's independent examiner or financial auditors;
- f) reporting on financial matters to the Members of FIGO; and
- g) being familiar with documents produced by the Charity Commission on the internal financial controls for charities.
- h) serving as Chair of the Publications Management Board (and reporting associated activities to the President).

Dr Ralph Hale (USA) is the current Honorary Treasurer and, having served two terms of office, is not eligible for re-election to this position under the terms of Article 24.4 of the FIGO Articles but is eligible for election to another Officer Trustee position under the terms of Article 24.4 of the FIGO Articles.

## The Honorary Secretary

Bye Law 3.8 sets out the role of the President Elect as follows.

The Honorary Secretary shall be responsible for:

- a) the custody and proper maintenance of the records of FIGO. (Those records required by the Companies Act 2006 as amended are to be kept at the registered office);
- b) ensuring that company law, charity law and any regulatory requirements are complied with;
- c) liaising with the President and CEO to plan, arrange and produce agendas for board meetings and subsequent minutes; and
- d) ensuring meetings comply with the Articles and any procedures set out by the Board of Trustees.

Dame Professor Lesley Regan (United Kingdom) is the current Honorary Secretary and is eligible for re-election to this position under the terms of Article 24.4 of the FIGO Articles or for election to a different Officer Trustee position.

## **The Regional Trustees**

Bye Law 3.10 sets out the role of the Regional Trustees as follows.

Regional Trustees shall be responsible for;

- Obtaining input from other member societies in their respective region to ensure effective regional representation
- b) Working collaboratively with the regional representatives of the five FIGO regions
- c) Contributing regional consideration to new FIGO initiatives and communications.

Nominations are open for 5 Regional Trustee positions to represent each of the five, separate FIGO regions i.e. Africa-Eastern Mediterranean, Asia-Oceania, Europe, Latin America and North America. There are no previous postholders (as this is the first election for FIGO Regional Trustees).

## Nominations for Societies to be represented on FIGO Council

Please read the notes carefully before making any nominations.

Forms that do not comply with the stipulated criteria and/or do not provide the necessary supporting information will not be considered.

## **General Nomination guidance**

- 1. The FIGO Council shall comprise:
  - a) the Trustees; and
  - b) up to twenty-four (24) Member Societies
- 2. Council Member Organisations elected at the General Assembly held in 2015 shall cease to hold office at the close of the General Assembly held in 2021.
- Council Member Organisations elected at the General Assembly held in 2018 shall cease to hold office at the close of the General Assembly held in 2023, subject to being eligible for reelection.
- 4. The Council Member Organisations represent the Voting Members of FIGO and shall have the role of advising and making recommendations to the Board of Trustees and such other functions as may be delegated to them by the Board of Trustees under terms of reference set by the Board of Trustees or in the Bye-Laws.
- 5. Each Council Member Organisation shall hold office for a term of four years from the close of the General Assembly at which it was elected and is then eligible for re-election for one or more further terms of four years.
- 6. To ensure appropriate representation of Members in each Region, the following will apply:
  - a) a Region containing ten or less Members shall be entitled to a minimum of two such Members as Council Member Organisations;
  - b) a Region containing eleven to twenty Members shall be entitled to a minimum of three such Members as Council Member Organisations; and
  - a Region containing over twenty Members shall be entitled to a minimum of four such Members as Council Member Organisations
- 7. Twelve (12) Council members will be elected in 2021, each for a period of four years.
- 8. Member Societies are eligible for re-election once they have completed their four-year term of office.
- 9. All member societies nominated for membership of the Council will be asked to:
  - Confirm that the society wishes to be considered for election to FIGO's Council.

- Confirm that the society will use its best endeavours to ensure that a representative will be present at all meetings of the FIGO Council during its term of office.
- Confirm that the society accepts and acknowledges that FIGO will be unable to provide financial assistance for the travel and accommodation costs of Council member representatives and that all societies elected to the FIGO Council will be responsible for their member representative's costs.
- 10. Societies might wish to consider nominating female colleagues in order to achieve gender balance.
- 11. Consideration should also be given to member societies that have contributed to FIGO, to the advancement of the speciality and to the promotion of the health care of women and children.
- 12. The Council Members in Table A below will continue to serve as Council Members until 2023 and are therefore <u>not eligible</u> for nomination in this election.

## Please also note the following:

- For the avoidance of doubt, societies listed in black above can also nominate themselves as candidates for this election.
- All societies nominated will be approached to confirm their agreement to serve on the Council should they be elected.
- Societies who do not respond by the specified deadline or decline their nomination will not be put forward to the vote at the General Assembly.

## **Election of Council members**

- 1. Twelve (12) Council members will be elected in 2021, each for a period of four years until 2025.
- 2. Under the terms of Bye Law 4.5; 'To ensure appropriate representation of Members in each Region, the following will apply:
  - a) a Region containing ten or less Members shall be entitled to a minimum of two such Members as Council Member Organisations;
  - b) a Region containing eleven to twenty Members shall be entitled to a minimum of three such Members as Council Member Organisations; and
  - a Region containing over twenty Members shall be entitled to a minimum of four such Members as Council Member Organisations'
- 3. This means that the number of seats "guaranteed" on the Council for each FIGO region is as follows:

- 4. 'Guaranteed' seats are elected during the 'Regional Voting Rounds'
- 5. The number of societies elected during these "regional voting rounds" will depend on the number of existing societies from that region continuing their term of office on the Council; the

- aim will be to bring the number of society representatives from that region to the minimum specified under the Articles.
- 6. This means that, in this election, the following number of "guaranteed" seats will be available for election for each region:

- 7. Once all 6 additional "guaranteed" seats have been filled, a further voting round will then be undertaken with all remaining candidates from every region of the world (including any unsuccessful candidates from the previous regional voting round) being eligible for consideration.
- 8. The Council is comprised of 24 member societies (plus the FIGO Trustees). As such, a further 6 societies will be elected during this wider "global vote" as follows:

# Appendix 2: From the FIGO Articles and Bye Laws

## From the Articles: Clauses Relating to Nominations

- 10.9. A Non-Voting Member is: (a) not eligible for election as a member of the FIGO Council; (b) not entitled to nominate a candidate for election as a Trustee; (c) not entitled to vote at any general meeting of FIGO.
- 11.8. Each Council Member Organisation shall hold office for a term of four years from the close of the General Assembly at which it was elected and is then eligible for re-election for one or more further terms of four years.
- 22.3. No person shall be eligible to be appointed or elected as a Trustee: (a) unless he or she has attained the age of 25 years; (b) if he or she would be disqualified from acting under article 25 (disqualification and removal of Trustees); (c) unless he or she satisfies any eligibility criteria set out in Bye-Laws; (d) if at the time of nomination he or she is an officer or staff member of a Non-Voting Member.
- 22.4. One Regional Trustee shall be elected from candidates from each of the Regions who must be citizens of that Region (subject to nominations of at least one candidate from the Region). A candidate for Regional Trustee cannot be nominated in respect of more than one Region.
- 22.8. Each candidate for election as an Officer must be nominated by an officer of a Voting Member. A person cannot be nominated for more than one Officer post.
- 22.9. Each candidate for election as a Regional Trustee must be nominated by an officer of a Voting Member from the Region from whose candidates the Regional Trustee is to be elected.
- 22.10. A person cannot be nominated as a candidate for election for both Regional Trustee and an Officer
- 22.13. The procedures for nominations and conduct of elections and the method of the ballot shall be governed by the Bye-Laws.
- 22.16. An Officer shall not be elected or appointed under Articles 22 or 23 if as a result there shall be more than 2 (two) Officers who are from the same Region.
- 24.2. Upon retirement an Officer shall not be eligible for re-election to the office previously held except that each of the Honorary Treasurer and Honorary Secretary shall be eligible for re-election to the same office for one further term of two years.
- 24.3. Upon retirement a Regional Trustee shall not be eligible for re-election as a Regional Trustee but shall be eligible for election as an Officer
- 24.4. Upon retirement each of the Vice-President, Honorary Treasurer and Honorary Secretary shall be eligible for election to another Officer post but not as a Regional Trustee.
- 24.6. A person who has served four terms of two years as a Trustee shall not be eligible for reelection as a Trustee in any office or to take office as President.

24.7. A person who has served three terms of two years as a Trustee in any office shall not be eligible for election as President-Elect.

## From the Bye Laws: Clauses Relating to Nominations

- 3.1 The Trustees shall complete such documentation as may be required of them under the terms of the Articles and the Companies Acts to give effect to their appointment or to terminate the same. In particular, the Trustees shall consent to be directors and trustees of FIGO and any subsidiary of the FIGO to which they are appointed.
- 3.2 At least six months before the date set for the General Assembly, the Board of Trustees will send to each Voting Member notice to request the Voting Members' nominations for Officers and Regional Trustees in accordance with Article 22.7 and shall provide them with criteria and guidelines to be applied when nominating candidates.
- 3.3 Each candidate for election as an Officer Trustee must be nominated by a senior official of the nominating society of a country where the Officer Trustee candidate holds citizenship.
- 3.4 The method of conducting the ballot and counting the votes for the election of Officers, the Regional Trustees and Council members at a General Assembly shall be prescribed in notes accompanying the notice of meeting.
- 4.1 The Council Member Organisation shall be elected by the Voting Members in General Assembly and shall comprise of up to twenty-four (24) Members of FIGO. The method of conducting the ballot and counting the votes for the election shall be prescribed in notes accompanying the notice of the General Assembly meeting.
- 4.2 Each Council Member Organisation shall nominate one natural person to be its representative. The nominee shall be of good and reputable character and fulfil any criteria or guidelines set out by the FIGO Council.
- 4.3 The number of Council Member Organisations elected to the FIGO Council shall not exceed one-third of the total number of Members of FIGO.
- 4.4 Representatives of Council Member Organisations shall be nominated by taking into consideration their contribution, past and present, to FIGO, to the advancement of the specialty of gynaecology and obstetrics, to the promotion of health care for women and children, and also taking into consideration that geographical, cultural and linguistic representation is maintained on the FIGO Council.
- 4.5 To ensure appropriate representation of Members in each Region, the following will apply:
  - a) a Region containing ten or less Members shall be entitled to a minimum of two such Members as Council Member Organisations;
  - b) a Region containing eleven to twenty Members shall be entitled to a minimum of three such Members as Council Member Organisations; and
  - c) a Region containing over twenty Members shall be entitled to a minimum of four such Members as Council Member Organisations.

- 4.6 No Council Member Organisation can have more than one representative on the FIGO Council. No Council Member Organisation representative may be a Trustee and if he or she becomes a Trustee at the same time as being a representative, he or she will automatically cease to be a representative and the Member will have to nominate another representative.
- 4.7 The representatives are appointed in their capacity as representatives of their Council Member Organisation and not as individuals and are required to be present at each FIGO Council Meeting Such representative can be changed by the Council Member Organisation giving the Trustees and the FIGO Council members prior written notice in a form and at such times as the Trustees may decide from time to time.
- 4.8 (Subject to Byelaw 4.9) representatives of Council Member Organisations shall serve a maximum of four consecutive years and may only be re-nominated for one further maximum term of four consecutive years if they have had a break of two years after completion of their first term. This restriction shall also apply where a person is nominated to represent a different Council Member Organisation.
- 4.9 The representatives of Council Member Organisations who were in office on 6 December 2020 may remain serving until the General Assembly held in 2021. The representatives of those Council Member Organisations who were elected at the General Assembly held in 2015 may serve until the close of the General Assembly held in 2021 and the representatives of those Council Member Organisations who were elected at the General Assembly held in 2018 may serve until the close of the General Assembly held in 2023, subject to being eligible for re-election.

# Appendix 4: Frequently asked questions (FAQs)

## Does our Society need to be up to date with all our fees to nominate?

Yes. In order to nominate candidates, any outstanding fees or dues must be fully paid no later than Monday 7th June.

## How many nominations can I submit for Officer Trustee positions?

. You may submit only 1 nomination for each of the Officer Trustee positions.

## How many nominations can I make for Regional Trustee positions?

You may submit only 1 nomination for each Regional Trustee position N.B. you may only nominate a candidate for your own region. The candidate must be a citizen of a country from within your region.

## How many nominations can I make for Council positions?

You are encouraged to make up to 12 nominations for positions on the Council.

#### What is the deadline for nominations?

14.00 hrs UTC on Monday 7th June.

#### When will the list of candidates be made available?

No later than 21st July.

## When will we know the voting procedure for this election?

This will be circulated on 9th July with the formal notice of the General Assembly.

## What are the 4 Officer Trustee positions to be elected?

President Elect, Vice President, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer.

## What are the 5 Regional Trustee positions to be elected?

There are 5 Regional Trustee positions to represent each of the five, separate FIGO regions i.e. Africa-Eastern Mediterranean, Asia-Oceania, Europe, Latin America and North America.

## Do both Officer Trustees and Regional Trustees sit on the FIGO Trustee Board?

Yes.

# Do candidates for the President Elect position need to be citizens of a country from within the Africa Eastern Mediterranean region?

Yes. This is set out in the regional rotation of the Office of President.

## Can I nominate an individual for both an Officer Trustee and a Regional Trustee position?

No, you cannot nominate the same individual for more than one position.

Can I nominate my own Society as a candidate for the Council election? Yes.

Our society has just completed two terms of three years on Council, are we still eligible for re-election?

Yes.
